It is my great pleasure to write a letter of support on behalf of Dr. Carlos Raimundo. I am Physician-Scientist currently involved in active research of the biological role of nitric oxide in health and disease in the Department of Molecular and Medical Pharmacology at UCLA in direct association with Dr. Louis Ignarro (Nobel Laureate for Physiology or Medicine 1998). I have known Dr. Raimundo for more than a year in which we have been exchanging scientific information and planning future collaborations using the principles of the Strategic Relationship Management Model he has developed using the methodological approach of "The Play of Life".

I believe that the Play of Life, the method utilized in Relationship Capital could affect neuro-immunological responses positively affecting the body in ways that medicine may not be able access. In our particular area of research we are suggesting the possibility of using this type of approach from a diagnostic perspective as well as a therapeutic intervention. The clear advantage this method offers over alternatives techniques is the universality of the conventions used to communicate with subjects with different cultural and sociological backgrounds allowing a simple and objective way of intervention. Moreover, there are multiplicities of potential applications in the field of neuroimaging for the assessment of neuropsychological patterns in the brain before and after the intervention with the Play of Life and its impact in the immune system.
